

Bartering

People first traded by **bartering**. Bartering is where goods and services are swapped with each other. No money is used in bartering.



A Closer Look

I have corn but want beads. You have beads but want corn. We could barter corn for beads. People have bartered for thousands of years. And they still do it today.



Julia bartered 3 corncobs for 1 string of beads.

a. Draw the table below and continue the pattern.

Number of strings of beads	1	2	3	4	5	6
Number of corncobs	3	6	9			

b. How many corncobs does Julia need to barter for 6 strings of beads?

Bartering takes a lot of work. First, you have to **bargain**. You have to agree what things are worth. How much corn should I trade for beads?

Second, what if I want your beads but you don't want my corn? We'd have to find someone else who wants corn. She would need to have something that you want—like milk.



Then I could give her my corn. She could give you her milk. You could give me your beads. It's all very tricky!
