

Animals on Our Minds

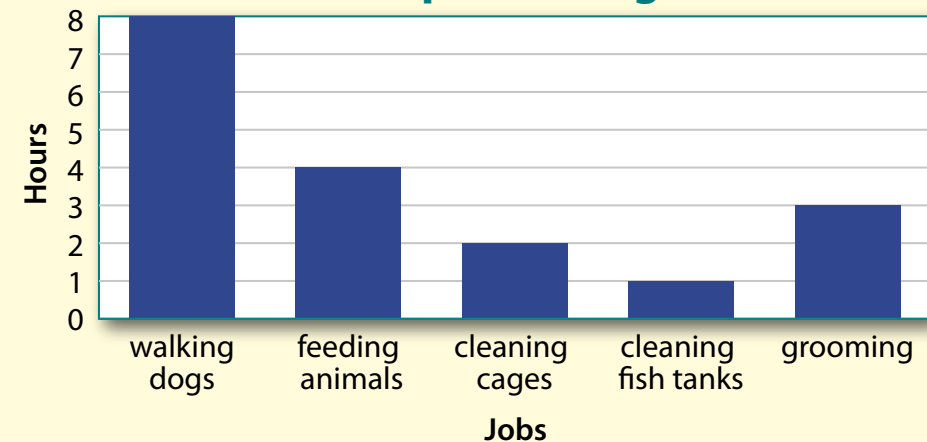
