
Amusement Parks




History of Amusement Parks

The first amusement parks began in Europe in the 1500s. They were called pleasure gardens. This is because there were many attractions that made people happy. There was music, games, and rides. There were also flower gardens, fountains, and stage shows. In the 1600s, many of the pleasure gardens shut down.



Amusement parks were not popular again until the 1800s. Parks started to make roller coasters. The first roller coaster in the United States was built in Coney Island. It opened in 1884.
