What You Need

- hammer
- two steel nails
- block of wood or Styrofoam

- C battery
- light bulb
- metal paper clip

- electrical wire
- small objects


What to Do

- 1 Hammer the two nails into the block, 2 cm apart.
- 2 Use electrical wire to attach the battery to one nail. Attach the light bulb to the other nail. Then, use a third piece of wire to connect the light bulb to the other end of the battery.
- 3 Place a paper clip across the nails on the block. The light should turn on. The paper clip is a conductor.
- 4 Now, test to see if any of the small objects are also conductors. Place each one across the nails on the block. Record your results.
